



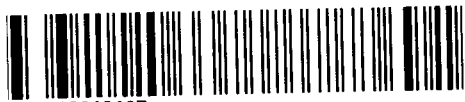

Oggetto: Riapertura esportazioni di prodotti a base di carne suina dall'Italia verso Taiwan.

Si fa riferimento e seguito alla nota DGISAN prot. 6644-27/02/2020 con la quale veniva comunicata la sospensione del riconoscimento dell'Italia come Paese indenne da peste suina africana e il conseguente blocco dell'esportazione di carni e prodotti a base di carne suina verso la Repubblica di Cina (Taiwan).

La competente Direzione Generale di Sanità Animale e dei Farmaci Veterinari si è immediatamente adoperata per richiedere alle Autorità Taiwanesi di rivalutare la posizione assunta e la situazione epidemiologica italiana. A seguito del positivo confronto tecnico intercorso tra la DGSAF e il BAPHIQ e della favorevole valutazione della documentazione inviata da parte italiana, ~~è con estrema soddisfazione che si comunica la riapertura di questo mercato.~~ In allegato è possibile riscontrare il documento inviato dal BAPHIQ ed entrato in vigore il 31 luglio 2020, con il quale Taiwan riconosce il nostro Paese come indenne da peste suina africana, ad esclusione della Sardegna.

Si precisa pertanto, che a partire da tale data, è possibile riprendere sia le esportazioni delle merci, comprese quelle prodotte o in fase di produzione nel periodo di sospensione, sia l'introduzione delle materie prime per la trasformazione.

Si pregano gli Enti in indirizzo di voler dare comunicazione di quanto sopra a tutti gli operatori interessati.

RE: Recognition of Italy (excluding Sardinia Island) as free of African swine fever.

Accordance: Pursuant to paragraph 1 of Article 33 of the Statute for Prevention and Control of Infectious Animal Disease.

Details:

1. Modification of recognized foot and mouth disease, rinderpest, contagious bovine pleuropneumonia, African swine fever, glanders, highly pathogenic avian influenza, Newcastle disease, and rabies free countries (zones) are listed in Table 1, "List of the recognized foot and mouth disease, rinderpest, contagious bovine pleuropneumonia, African swine fever, glanders, highly pathogenic avian influenza, Newcastle disease, and rabies free countries (zones)." Countries (zones) not listed in Table 1 are regarded as disease-status unknown or disease-infected countries (zone). The importation of articles subject to animal quarantine from countries (zones) where not listed in Table 1, shall comply with the "Quarantine Requirements for the Importation of Animals and Animal Products" and its relevant regulations on disease-infected countries (zones).

2. Countries (zones) with reported case(s) of bovine spongiform encephalopathy are listed in Table 2, "List of countries (zones) with reported case(s) of bovine spongiform encephalopathy." Cattle, meat-and-bone meal, meat meal, bone meal, poultry meal, blood meal, animal fat and oil for feed, animal greaves for feed, bovine serum, and other animal products that may transmit bovine spongiform encephalopathy originated from the listed countries (zones) are not allowed to be imported into the Republic of China, except those which are approved by Bureau of Animal and Plant Health Inspection and Quarantine.
3. Any application of animals and animal products to animal quarantine authorities since the effective date (inclusive) of this announcement is subject to the relevant regulations of the Statute for Prevention and Control of Infectious Animal Disease.
